RULES FOR A 'STICK' COMPETITION

1. A **'STICK'** competition is a fun event. The object is to see how far each player can get around the course with a given (calculated) stroke allowance.
2. The stroke allowance will be determined by adding the players age to his handicap and the par of the course and dividing the total by 3.

Eg, Henry's allowance would be:

Age	71
Handicap	17
Course par	70
Total	158
Divide by 3 =	52.67
Stroke allowance	53 (rounded up)

3. The competition is played from the yellow tees over 15 holes (1-11 & 15-18 inclusive). The gross score, including any penalty strokes shall be recorded after each hole.
4. The first group out will take **'The Stick'** which should be planted in the centre of the fairway at a point level with the position reached with the last shot of the stroke allowance of the player in the group who has progressed the furthest who shall write their name on the attached card.
5. The next group play in the same way until their stroke allowances are used up. If one of them passes the distance achieved by the preceding group, the **'The Stick'** is moved forward and the new name recorded.
6. Each group walks in once the final member has used his stroke allowance.
7. The winner shall be the player who progresses the furthest around the course
